Answer 8:

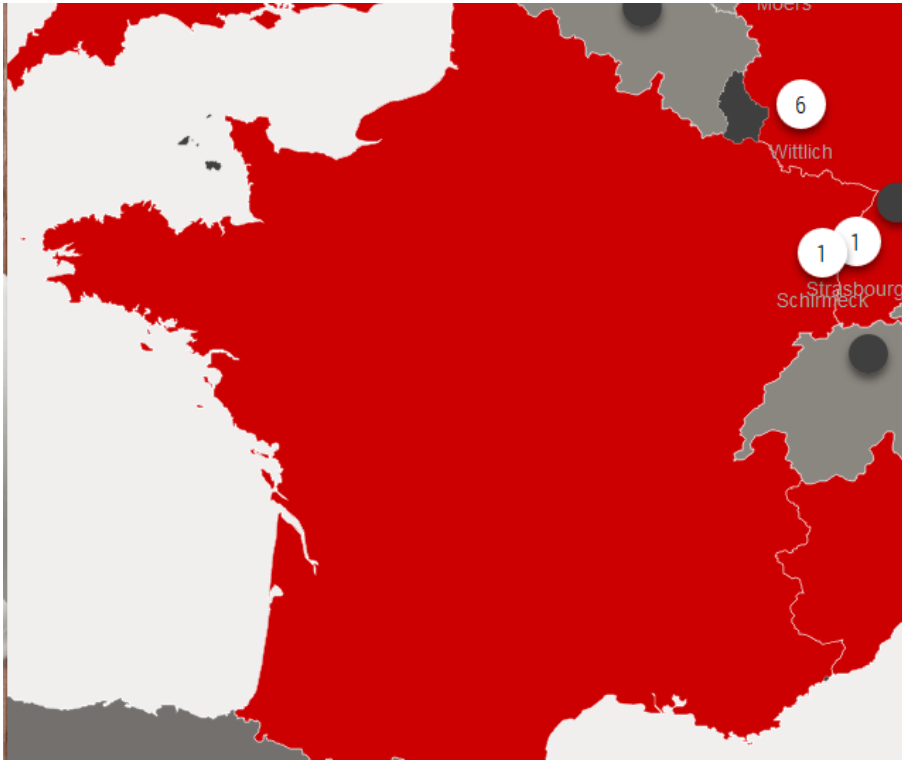
